Coming to School

Open Days

Usually Parents and grandparents are invited to see the school in action at least twice during the year. We will let you officially know when this is going to happen. For Reception children we will wait until the children have settled in before inviting you to the school for an open morning.



Parents' Evenings

Parents' evenings are held twice per year. During the Autumn and Spring terms there will be the opportunity to speak to the teacher to discuss your child's progress. At the moment

these are being held virtually. In the Summer term you can book an appointment if you wish to do so.

Collective Worship

We hold a daily act of collective worship. As part of this we look at our school values which change on a half termly basis.

Whenever possible we invite the local church into school to lead our collective worship. For key festivals during the year we visit the local church and hold a special celebration at the church.

Once a week starting at 2.45 p.m., we celebrate the successes of the previous week with all the children and parents in our hall. Parents/carers are invited if your child is receiving an award.

School Uniform

Art and outside clothes

It would be appreciated if parents could provide protective clothing for use during art activities. An old shirt for the older children and a plastic apron for the younger children will lessen the damage to clothes. As outdoor learning is going to be more a part of our curriculum we would like all our children to have Wellington boots and water proofs at school. Please make sure that ALL items are properly labelled, so lost items can easily be recognised.

Sportswear

For PE and most games children should wear shorts, a team colour or white T-shirt and gym shoes are needed. For indoor activities they should go bare-footed or wear clean trainers. During winter months children will be allowed to wear track suits and trainers outside. Outdoor footwear should come in a plastic bag.

The School day

The school day usually starts at 8:55am and ends at 3:15pm. Doors open at 8:45am. Currently our start and finish times are staggered due to Covid-19.

Arrival (when we are not staggering times)

Children should arrive at school between 8:45am and 8:55 am when there will be start of the day activities. Children enter and leave school via the playground, please do not use the main school door. Parents are encouraged to leave the playground as soon as possible to allow the gates to be locked and the teachers to take the children into their classrooms. Children should not arrive before 8:45am, unless supervised or attending our Breakfast Club and we cannot accept liability for those who do.



Lunch Time

Our school lunches are cooked onsite by Norse catering. We can certainly recommend them as both quantity and quality are good. There is a variety of choices every day including jacket potatoes and vegetarian meals. For more information contact Mrs Tumath in the office.

Before and after school

We offer a Breakfast Club before school (details on the website) and a variety of after school clubs, some of them free of charge. After school clubs will be announced in our newsletter. We work closely with outside agencies including Premier Sports.

Your role as a parent / parental involvement

Volunteers

We welcome volunteers in our school to support children with their learning and with activities such as school trips. If you have any talents you want to share with our children, please contact the Head Teacher.

As a school we have a friendly Friends committee who are working incredibly hard to get extra funding in for the school. If you would like to become involved as well please contact our Head Teacher or contact Mrs Marison.

If you are interested in volunteering on a regular basis, you will need a DBS check. Please, contact Mrs Tumath in the first instance.



Homework

Evidence has shown that parents have more influence on children's learning than anyone else.

Therefore we would ask you to plan some time to support your children daily with their reading and other homework tasks. The homework tasks have clear objectives, yet can be completed in any way the children like.

Our Curriculum

Our curriculum is literacy based and linked to topics that lend themselves to a particular genre. We aim to inspire the children with

Aims of our Curriculum

Through our curriculum teaching, we have the following aims for our pupils.

These are:

- *To provide challenge, enjoyment, personalisation and progression*
- *To provide children with the skills they need to succeed*
- *To be able to reflect and evaluate*
- *To develop pupils' independence so that they are able to apply their learning independently*
- *To develop a secure subject knowledge which they are able to apply and retain*
- *To develop and broaden pupils understanding of language and vocabulary and be able to apply this to everyday conversations and learning*
- *To encourage pupils to take pride in all that they do*

Knowledge Rich Curriculum (Knowledge Led)

At the Dove Federation we have designed a curriculum which focuses on the knowledge we wish to teach our children. Our aim is to ensure that the knowledge which is taught is in-depth, can be recalled and applied within learning. Language acquisition is a key focus, we wish to develop and enhance pupils understanding and use of language through the curriculum.

Wherever possible we try to ensure that the knowledge that we teach is influenced by the pupil's interests. All of our learning is led by the National Curriculum and we use progression maps to ensure that the National Curriculum is being effectively covered.

How we deliver our curriculum

At the Dove Federation, each National Curriculum subject is timetabled into a weekly timetable to ensure that there is adequate coverage. In order to further enhance and allow for further opportunities for curriculum coverage we try to plan curriculum theme days for religious education, humanities, science and the arts. We also try to plan engaging school trips, which enhance the curriculum we are teaching.

How we teach

We try to use a variety of different ways to teach across the curriculum to ensure that all learning styles are catered for. As it, usually takes at least 3 times of hearing, seeing and doing something for a new skill and knowledge to be retained we try and re-visit previous learning as often as possible. Whenever possible we try to make lessons practical, investigative and active and try to create a good balance between this style of teaching and written work. This means that not all learning is recorded in books. We try to keep evidence of the practical work that we do through creating displays of our work and putting photographs of our practical work in a whole class floor book.

In line with our school vision we try to encourage and foster individual talents and promote opportunities for pupils to use these within our wider curriculum and extra-curricular activities. With this in mind all pupils within Key Stage 2 have the opportunity to access specialist music teaching as part of the weekly music lesson and also extra tuition. All pupils during the course of the academic year receive specialist teaching during their physical education lessons and have the opportunity to attend sports clubs.

Communication

Letters Home

Whenever possible we always try to send our letters via email and communication via text message and also on our school website. Paper copies of letters will also be available in the reception area of the school in case you do not have internet or a printer. Please ensure that the office has your up to date email addresses and mobile telephone numbers. If you wish to receive the letters by paper format please let the office know.



Data Collection

Every year we will ask you to confirm that the information we

hold about you and your family is accurate and up to date. Please let us know if anything changes, as it is essential in case we need to contact you during the school day.



Website

Our website is a useful source of information about our school, containing essential information regarding pupils, parents, our curriculum and a list of important dates. It is regularly updated so please do use it to check for any information you might be looking for.

More Information

Sickness Absence

If your child is not well enough to attend school, please let us know before registration. Mrs Tumath will, as part of our cluster policy, ask the reason for absence. There is a leaflet available at the office to guide you in case you are not sure your child should come into school. Most of the time we find though that children feel better as soon as they are in school. If your child is ill for more than one day please contact the school every morning before 9:00am. This is for safeguarding reasons!



Holidays

A good attendance, more than 97%, will help improve your child's success at school. Taking time off for a holiday during term time will not be authorised, except in exceptional circumstances.

Medicines

When it is essential for your child to have medication during the school day we require a signed letter from you as a parent, stating what the medicine is, who it is for, the dosage, when to give it and for how many days.

Injury or Illness

When your child is hurt or becomes unwell at school we will administer first aid. In case of a concern we will contact you. If we are unable to contact you, we will contact a health professional. Please make sure your address and telephone numbers are up to date!

Swimming

Pupils in Year 3, 4 and 5 attend weekly swimming lessons every Thursday afternoon during the Autumn and Spring terms.

Swimming lessons take place at Dereham Leisure Centre where a swimming instructor is in attendance. Pupils are also accompanied by school staff and parent volunteers.

Complaints

We recognise that complaints might sometimes occur and we take them seriously. If you have a complaint, then please speak to the teacher first. If you wish to take the matter further speak to the Head Teacher. If the matter is still unresolved, please ask for details of the Complaints Procedure.
