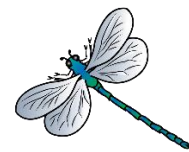

Safeguarding

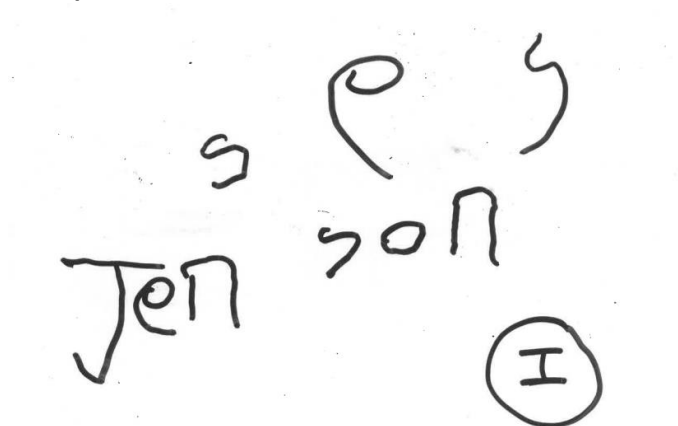
