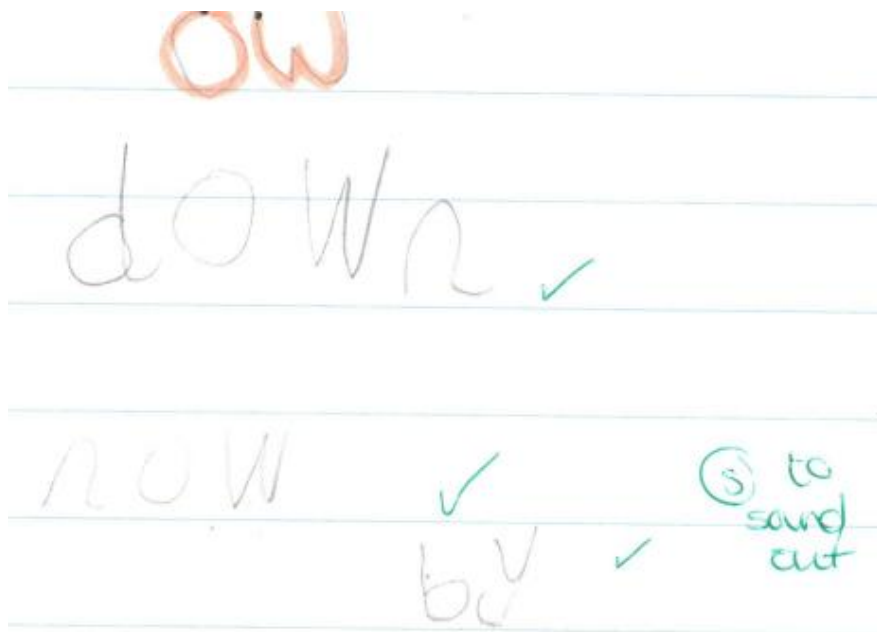

Caterpillar Class have been learning some new digraphs in phonics this week. Look at how beautiful this handwriting is.

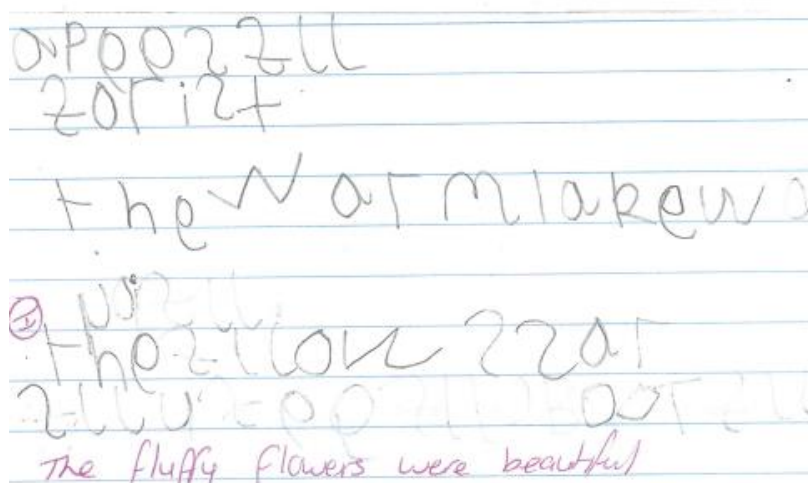

Incomplete

Because it has only one wire connected to the cell/battery. Even tho the wire is correct there just needs to be another wire to make the light bulb light up.



Incomplete

Because you need to put the wire on ever-side of the battery. So the electricity can move around in a circle and it create's a circuit. So then the light bulb can light up.



complete

Because the wires are around the cell/battery to create a circuit and the light has lit up.



Incomplete

Because the wires don't go round to the battery for the light to light up. And the two wires are connected instead of the battery.

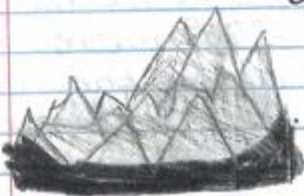
